Author Workflow for Wiley Hybrid Journals

After articles are accepted for publication, authors will be invited into Wiley Authors to complete the next steps in the publication journey of their articles.

Authors will need to confirm on their author roles, research funders, institutional affiliations and choose between publishing their articles behind the paywall or open access. If they select the latter, they will be asked to sign a Creative Commons license, before APC funding requests are generated to institutions for their review, based on the responsible corresponding authors' institutional affiliations.

Institutional OA administrators will need to review and approve/reject the applications on their accounts upon receiving the requests..

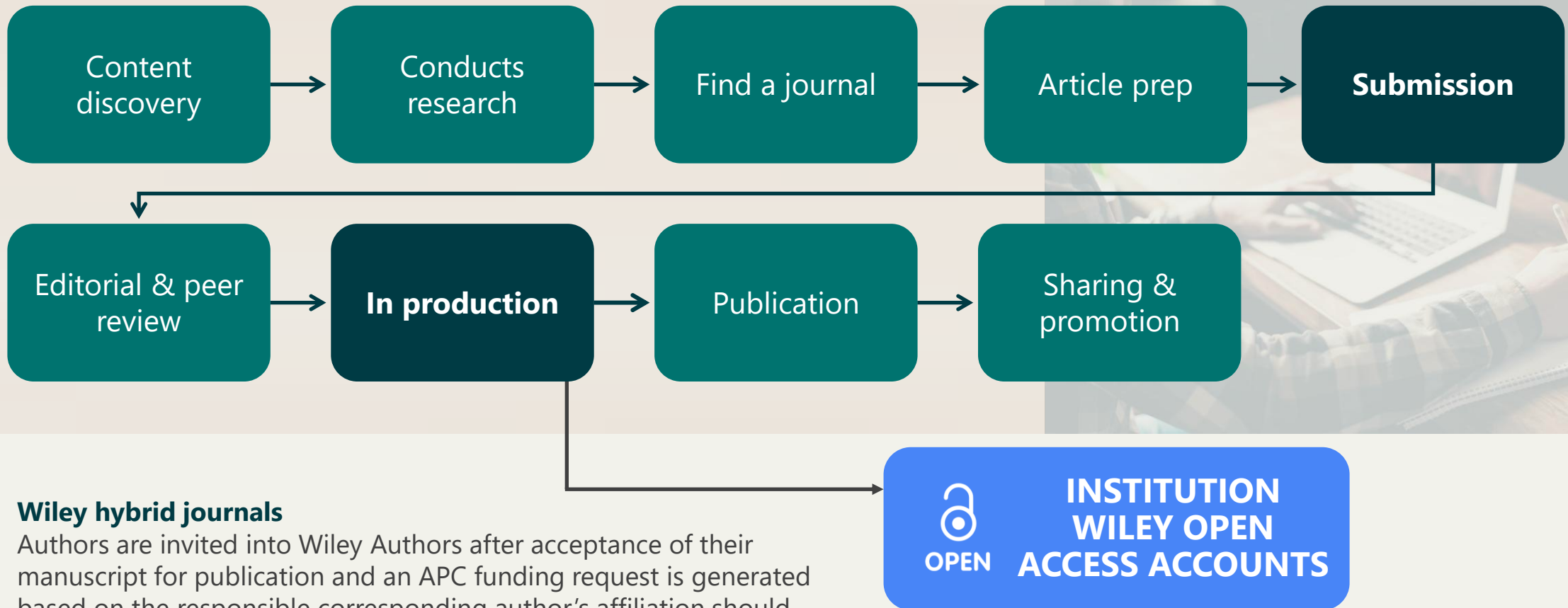

Authors are invited into Wiley Authors after acceptance of their manuscript for publication and an APC funding request is generated based on the responsible corresponding author's affiliation should they choose to publish their articles open access.




